Committee aspirations:

1. Network with other city committees that intersect with forestry committee interests
2. Continue to manage Butler Head focusing on:
 - forest management to deal with pests and pathogens,
 - marking boundaries (141 acres)
 - controlling invasive species

- expanding Butler Head (41-acre donation)
 - maple syrup sale
3. Continue to manage community nursery, focusing on:
 - expand to include a larger suite of species such as native shrubs
 - relocate mature stock and plant new stock to areas in need of restoration (ex.: ponds at the cemetery and strip along the backside of the current nursery, pump station)
 - set up a pocket park as a demonstration site
 - collaborate with local funeral homes and/or gardening centers to initiate a “memory tree” program
 - develop an “in memoriam” walkway near nursery, in/adjacent to cemetery
 4. Develop a resource for homeowners wanting to choose native plants for their property
 5. Expand educational offerings to include guided public hikes at Butler Head - bird walks (spring), mushroom walk (summer/fall), insect walk (summer/fall), tree i.d. (leaf on and leaf off)
