Thence southerly along the present easterly line of Floral Street about one hundred eight (108) feet to a point, said point being at the southwesterly end of the southeasterly boundary line of Court Street Fxtension to be herinafter described.

Southeasterly Boundaxy Line of Court Street Extension.

Beginning at a point in the present southeasterly line of Court Street, said point being twenty-five (25) feet southeasterly from and as measured alone a line normal to the base line of court Street fixtension at about Sta. 4+49;

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Thence southwesterly along a curved line twentyfive (25) feet southeasterly from and concentric with a $15^{\circ}-00^{\prime}$ curve of the base line of Court Street Extension about twenty-eight (28) feet to a point on a line at right angles to the base line of Court Street Extension at P.T. Sta. $4+75.50$;

Thence S. $77^{\circ}-08^{\prime}-10^{\prime \prime}$ W. three hundred four and five tenths (304.5) feet to a point twenty-five (25) feet southeasterly from and as measured along a line at right angles to the base line of Court Street Extension at Sta. $7+80$;

Thence southwesterly by a direct course about thirty-six (36) feet to a point, said point being at the southwesterly end of the Northwesterly Boundary Iine ofof Court Street fixtension hereinbefore describea.

The hereinbefore described Bawe Line and Boundary Iines are as shown on a plan entitled "Right of Way Map, State Highway '26'" Bath, Sagadahoc County dated December 1964 and on file in the office of the Department of Transportation, Bureau of Highways at Augustia (S.H.C. File No. 12-56) and is recorded in the registry of Deeds of Sagadahoc County Plan Book 8 Page 36A.

No objectors appearing at the legally posted meeting as prescribed by law and no other business to appear before the Council, Chairman Mitchell declared the meeting adjourned at 6:00 P. M. o' clock.
